

The Texas Power Grid

As we kick off August- typically the hottest month of the year and the beginning of peak hurricane season—the strength of the state power grid infrastructure are top of mind for many Texans.



High temperatures, rapid population growth and an influx new companies in the state continue to squeeze Texas'power grid.

This August, there is a 12% chance of rotating power outages on nights with little wind, according to the Electric Reliability Council, which operates the power grid for 90% of the state. It is expected demand for energy may nearly double in the next few years. Last summer, demand on the grid reached a record of 85,508 megawatts—and was recorded as Texas' hottest year on record, and some portions of the state have already experienced temperatures over 100 degrees this year.

During summer, the strain on the power grid is typically highest from 8-9 p.m., when more people are using electricity and less solar power is available. If wind power production is also low, ERCOT may ask Texans to reduce their energy use. The grid operator called for energy conservation 11 times last summer.

Eighty-four percent of Texas voters expect they will be asked to conserve power this summer, while 63% expect temporary power outages.

Recipe Corner

Mason Jar Key Lime Sundae Trifle

- 1 Key Lime Pie thawed
- 1 bag Key Limes
- 14 oz condensed milk
- 2/3 cup key lime juice
- Zest of 2-3 key limes
- 1 sleeve graham crackers
- 3 Tbs butter melted
- · Whipped topping garnish

Directions

- In a small pot, combine condensed milk, 2/3 cup key lime juice, and zest
- 2. Stir over low heat and allow to bubble for 1-2 minutes, stirring constantly
- 3. Set aside
- **4.** In a large bowl, crush graham cracker crumbs and stir in melted butter
- 5. Using small mason jars, fill bottom with a layer of graham cracker crumbs, followed by a few spoonfuls of Key Lime Pie (just the filling)
- **6.** Top with a layer of whipped topping, additional graham cracker crumbs and key lime syrup

Architectural Control Committee

Report Your Outage

The Public Utility Commission of Texas (PUCT) is asking Houston-area customers to share their experiences with power outages during the May 2024 derecho and Hurricane Beryl. Nearly one million Texans lost power in May 2024 following the wind storm. And last month, over 2 million people were without power after Hurricane Beryl hit and left many without power for days. The PUCT said they are investigating the preparedness and response to extreme weather events by utilities in the Houston area, at the direction of Gov. Greg Abbott.

Deed Restriction Violations and Yard Upkeep

It is the responsibility of each homeowner to maintain and upkeep their property. Lawn maintenance, trimming / pruning bushes, hedges, ornamental trees, and flower beds free of weeds and dead flowers, broken garage door, hanging gutters, rotted wood visible from the street, etc. If you rent your home, ensure your renters are aware of their responsibilities as well. A well-kempt neighborhood helps maintain property values.

Privacy Fence Replacement

If your privacy fence needs replacing due to hurricane Beryl or old age, collaborate with your neighbor(s) to discuss sharing the expense. Although it's common courtesy for homeowners to share the expense, it is not a requirement nor is there anything the HOA Board can do should a neighbor refuse. Those expenses and decisions are between homeowners.

Tree Trimming

With the recent hurricane and the resulting number of damaged trees, it is important to remove dead branches and prune large trees to prevent damage to your home or your neighbor's home during future storms. If there are dead limbs hanging over your roof or fence, consider getting the tree(s) properly cleaned up. Vehicle Violations

Commercial vehicles or vehicles purposed for commercial use, mobile homes, recreational vehicles, boats, trailers, etc. must be properly stored in your garage. Disabled vehicles of any type with flat tires, on blocks, parked on street with expired registration are also deed restriction violations.
