Mission Bend: Construction & Infrastructure Projects

Alief Linear Forest - Using \$2 million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding as part of a Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design initiative, to plant 1,200 trees along 17 miles of roads in Alief. The program aims to help reduce or prevent crime through the installation of sidewalks, streetlights and green spaces

Sidewalks – O'Donnell - Connections to O'Donnell Middle School and Hearne Elementary School along Sugarland-Howell Rd. and Tres Lagunas. Est Completion Date: Sep 2024.

Addicks Clodine - Sidewalks along Addicks Clodine Road and Westpark Dr. Est Completion Date: Complete. Connections to Taylor HS and Hicks ES along Canyon Hill Dr. and Hemlock Hill Dr. Est completion date: Oct 2024.

Alief Taylor H.S. Connections to Taylor and Kerr High Schools along Howell-Sugarland Rd and Pavilion Pt (to Hwy 6). Est Completion date: Complete.

Bellaire at Addicks Clodine -Connections to businesses, a church, and a fire station along Bellaire Blvd. at Addicks Clodine Rd. Est Completion Date: Sep 2024.

Bellaire at Howell-Sugarland - Design and construction of a 5' wide concrete sidewalk to include wheelchair ramps at all public street intersections, properly sloped driveways and retaining walls.

Mission Bend - Connections along Empanada Dr. including Marbella Dr. Est. Completion Date: Oct 2024

Hike & Bike - Design a pedestrian undercrossing along Brays Bayou under Addicks Clodine Road. Connects to Westpark Underpass.

Westpark Tollway - Replacement of Inlet Grates and various other repairs. Upgrading 591 inlet grates on both directions of the Westpark Tollway from Post Oak Boulevard to FM-1464/ South Barker Cypress Road.

Places to Find Free and Low-Cost Food Near Mission Bend

Harris County Pct 4 is working with local partners such as the Common Market and the Houston Food Bank to help get food to those who need it most. Harris County Public Health's Connect program also assists eligible families sign up for federal, state, and local benefits, including the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). Throughout Pct 4, there are dozens of organizations and programs dedicated to serving the community by providing free food and resources.

Below are programs and organizations near you:

Mission Bells:

Mission Bells is a volunteer-based ministry that assists those facing food insecurity. Its food pantry is open and available to families and unhoused individuals in Harris County. Online registration is required to receive food before coming on site, and you must show your registration card when you arrive. Registration cards can be



picked up on Wednesdays from 6 p.m. - 7 p.m. upon showing a valid ID.

West Houston Assistance Ministries (WHAM):

WHAM offers food assistance to residents of the Greater Houston area. Its food pantry provides families and individuals with staple and organic goods. WHAM's services include drive-thru distributions, walkup distributions, and drive-thru food fairs

My Brother's Keeper (Outreach Center):

My Brother's Keeper Food Pantry services families and individuals who face food insecurities and require staple pantry items. Walk-ins are available on a first come first serve basis.

Recipe Corner

GANDY GORN GELATIN GUPS





Ingredients

package of orange-flavored gelatin
package of lemon-flavored gelatin

2 c of whipped dairy topping

Instructions:

Make lemon gelatin according to package directions. Place 1/3 cup in 6 1-cup drinking glasses. Chill until firm, at least 4 hours. Repeat process with orange gelatin, placing it on top of the yellow gelatin. Chill until firm, at least 4 hours. Top with whipped topping

Fall Gardening Tips

September

Plant beets, broccoli, Brussels sprouts, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, Swiss chard, collards, kale, garlic, lettuce, mustard, parsley, English peas, radish, spinach and turnips.

October

Vegetables that can be transplanted or seeded in early October include beets, Brussels sprouts (plants), Swiss chard, collards, kale, lettuce, mustard, radish, spinach and turnips.

November

Use those fallen leaves to build a compost. Leaves and grass clippings are some of best ingredients to build a hot compost

December

Remove dead vegetation and weeds to prevent buildup of diseases, weeds and insects. Order spring seeds for early spring sowing and transplanting.


